**Teachers2Parents**, our text service provider, have introduced an additional new security verification measure to allow parents/guardians to check that the messages you receive are from school. Much like telephone banking, you will continue to receive messages from a secure number with the school message ID now in the body of the message, accompanied with a link at the beginning of the message to click through to a Teachers2Parents verification page; confirming that the sender of the message is genuine.

This added security measure is another step forward to help reassure parents/guardians of the safety and wellbeing of your child at school. If parents would prefer to take advantage of the Teachers2Parents app, please search and download 'Teachers2Parents' for free on iOS App store and Android smartphone devices. The app will have messages that the school send to parents, term dates and events reminders, please have a look and see what you think. If using the app you will not receive text messages.

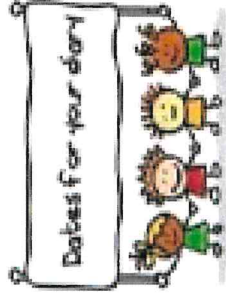
